

Prompt Engineering Reflection

As you can tell, this Resume was AI-enhanced, which was quite simple to do once the AI is given specific instructions. Google Gemini was my AI of choice; you can ask it unlimited questions or give it limitless prompts for it to respond to, as well as upload files to the website which the bot is able to read. Gemini is also able to respond in downloadable PDF's, .docx, and many other files.

The first thing I asked my AI helper for was to read the PDF I provided it, which was the first draft of the Resume I made on my own. I told it that we were asked to make it AI-enhanced, so the AI knew to make it as professional as possible without worrying about bypassing AI detection. I specifically told the AI that I wanted it to make my resume more driven towards the work field of psychological research (which is what I want to do as a career), and told it that "the resume should reflect my skills and experiences to make me a best fit for the (specific) role". **FURTHERMORE**, I told the AI about my past experiences in the psychology field, which included running 2 psychological experiments in college. All of this was taken into consideration, and the AI was able to spit out a way more professional, and neat resume than my original one.

The immediate and most obvious changes came from the general theme. Though they are alike in some ways, the AI enhanced resume focuses more on content than it does on appearance. It wanted to focus more on what exactly I did and its importance to the field I want to be in, so there are a lot more explanations for my skills and experiences. We can also see how it dropped my first job I worked, perhaps it was too long ago and not important to the field of Psychological Research. Though it is more content heavy which employers would probably be looking for, it seems very lengthy and unorganized. Psychological Research requires the researcher to be organized as well as being lengthy, since experiments usually take place over multiple days (up to years even); combining both my organization and the content within the AI-enhanced version, I believe it could make for a fantastic resume. Since I did not explicitly tell the AI to be organized within the re-creation of my resume, I did not expect it to be so. Engineering an AI is easy to do so, just prompt the bot with *exactly* what you want to be done. I think it is also important to separate "steps" within the engineering, that way the AI does not mix up certain parts of different steps (to do so, just press shift + enter twice to make a full blank line appear within the AI textbox). I know considering I am in an Information Systems class this won't be as much as an appeal to other students; however I believe for employers the addition of the AI resume is an advantage since Psychological Research is usually full of "serious" companies.
